
Tips on Storing and Preparing Dog Food and Treats



A checklist of tips on storing and preparing dog food and treats.





HOW TO STORE DOG FOOD AND TREATS:

\bigcirc	Practice first-in, first-out: use up older food first.
\bigcirc	Store dry food in an airtight container in a cool, dry place.
\bigcirc	Keep frozen food in the freezer until use.
\bigcirc	Bulging cans of wet food should be discarded.
WHEN FEEDING:	
	Either wet or dry food is fine. Consider a dental cleaning dry food if your dog has gingivitis, or soft foods for an elderly dog that has difficulty chewing.

\bigcirc	Throw food away moist, wet or raw food after two (2) hours if not eaten.
\bigcirc	Stainless steel dishes are best because they resist bacterial growth.
\bigcirc	Wash your hands with warm soapy water after handling dog food.
	Regularly wash and sanitize food dishes.
